- 1. TRISTANIA. laurina – A small, slow growing formal-looking evergreen tree. Grows to approximately 10' in height. Leaves are narrow to about 4" long producing a dense rounded crown. Flowers in late spring/early summer with small, yellow, clustered flowers. Tree can be seen at De Anza Blvd. Median strip between Pacifica Dr. & Rodrigues Ave.
- 2. MAGNOLIA. g. 'St. Mary' – Evergreen tree that usually grows to a height of 20'. Large glossy leaves. Produces full-sized white flowers. Known for heat resistance and tolerance of damp soil. Tree can be seen on Noel Dr.
- 3. PYRUS. callervana. 'Aristocrat' – Deciduous tree known as 'Flowering Pear'. Grows fast to 30' in height. Pyramidal in shape. Glossy, oval leaves to 3" long. Small, white clustered flowers appear late winter/early spring. Leaves turn to a purple red in fall. Tree can be seen on Stevens Creek Blvd median strip between Blaney Ave & Torre Ave.
- 4. PISTACIA. chinensis – Deciduous tree known as 'Chinese Pistache'. Shade tree growing to 60' in height. Leaves are narrow up to 4' long turning to a vivid red, yellow and orange in fall. Tree can be seen at City Hall on Rodrigues Ave @ Torre Ave.
- 5. LAGERSTROEMIA X FAURIEI HYBRIDS. 'Tuscarora' – Deciduous tree also known as 'Crape Myrtle'. Can grow to 30' in height. 1" – 2" oval, glossy leaves producing deep coral pink flowers in July-September. Considered mildew resistant. Tree can be seen at De Anza Blvd median strip (north-end) between Mariani Ave & 280 Freeway.
- 6. GINGKO biloba. 'Autumn Gold' – Deciduous tree grows to 30' – 50' in height. Broad, fan shaped leaves turning gold in fall. Not generally bothered by insects or diseases. Resistant to oak root fungus. Fruitless.
- 7. CELTIS. senensis. – Deciduous tree also known as 'Chinese Hackberry'. Related and similar to elm tree. Can grow to approximately 50' in height. Deep rooted with no surface roots. Smooth, glossy, scallop-toothed leaves to 4" long. Pink flowers in early spring. Known to be drought resistant.
- 8. CERCIS. canadensis – Deciduous tree also known as 'Eastern Redbud'. Can grow to 35' in height. Rich green leaves are 3" – 6" long with pointed tips producing round headed tree. Rosy pink flowers in early spring.
- 9 PRUNUS. cerasfera. 'Krauter Vesuvius' – Deciduous tree also known as 'Flowering Plum'. Wide, upright branching pattern to 18'. Leaves are deep purple in color. Light pink flowers in spring. Little or no fruit.
